## **THE CONFERENCE**

The International Conference on Treatment of Addictive Behaviors (ICTAB) began in 1979, communicating recent therapeutic methods and research knowledge to professionals working with the addictive behaviors. Committed to the integration of science and practice, ICTAB brings together international professionals from a variety of disciplines. An enduring focus of ICTAB is on commonalities in the etiology, process, and treatment of alcohol/drug abuse and other addictive behaviors. Previous ICTABs have been held in Australia, The Netherlands, Norway, Scotland, South Africa, Germany and the United States.

The Twelfth ICTAB is sponsored by the Center on Alcoholism, Substance Abuse, and Addictions (CASAA) of the University of New Mexico. ICTAB-12 will focus on the theme: ***Evidence-Based Treatment in Real World Systems: Maximizing Service, Value, and Outcome.*** As in previous ICTABs, three different types of presentations will be featured:

***Invited addresses*** will be given by prominent researchers in the addictive behaviors. These presentations will provide an overview of current research knowledge and its implications for clinical practice.

***Contributed presentations*** will describe specific research in a broad range of areas related to the nature and treatment of addictive behaviors. These will include selected symposia as well as poster sessions that allow personal interaction with presenters.

***Practitioner workshops*** will teach clinical intervention and research methods based on recent research findings.

## **THE LOCATION**

Santa Fe, founded in 1609, is the oldest capital city in the United States. Celebrating its 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary, this city is timeless; it has embraced three cultures for centuries: Native American, Hispanic, and Anglo. There really is no city quite like it. Its streets wind past gourmet restaurants, fine museums, Spanish churches, and countless world-class shops and galleries. Visitors to Santa Fe will be fascinated with the beautiful Indian jewelry and pottery being sold along the historic ***Old Town Plaza***. Within walking distance from the plaza is the oldest house in the US, and the famous and mysterious Loretto Chapel, known for its “miraculous staircase”. ## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

**Early Registration:** To preserve the quality of collegial interaction, ICTAB registration is limited to 300 participants. To guarantee your attendance, your registration accompanied with payment must be received no later than **December 11, 2009**. The registration fee is refundable for cancellations received *prior* to December 18, 2009 (minus a cancellation processing fee of \$125). No refunds *after* **December 18, 2009**.

**Registration Fee:** The registration fee includes admission to all three (3) days of conference functions, workshops (*except pre-conference workshops on Sunday, February 7*), refreshment breaks, two evening events (**Opening Reception** on Sunday, February 7, and **Conference Banquet** on Tuesday, February 9), and the cost of all distributed conference materials. Participants are required to wear a name badge to all conference functions. Non-registrants *will not* be admitted to conference sessions or workshops. All fees are payable in US dollars by check, bank wire transfer, Visa or MasterCard.

**Student Registration:** A limited number of reduced-fee student registrations (20) will be available through December 11, and will be processed in order of receipt until filled. To be eligible, the student must be enrolled full-time in a graduate training program, verified by letter from the program director accompanying the application. The registration fee *does not include tickets* for the *Opening Reception* and *Conference Banquet*. Tickets may be purchased separately (*see registration form*).

## **PRECONFERENCE WORKSHOPS**

Two one-day *pre-conference workshops* will be offered on Sunday, February 7 from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm. The registration fee is \$200. Enrollment will be limited to 40 persons per workshop.

**Workshop A: Working with Family Members to Engage Treatment-Refusers into Treatment: CRAFT**

*Robert J. Meyers, Ph.D., Faculty Emeritus, and Jane Ellen Smith, Ph.D., The University of New Mexico*

This workshop will provide an introduction to Community Reinforcement and Family Training (CRAFT). CRAFT is an empirically-supported treatment that teaches skills to the family members of treatment-refusing substance abusers. The goals of CRAFT are to teach these distressed family members how to engage resistant substance abusers into treatment while also improving their own psychosocial functioning. Lecture, role-plays, and group exercises will be used.

**Workshop B: Training and Supervision of Motivational Interviewing (MI)**

*William R. Miller, Ph.D., Emeritus, and Theresa B. Moyers, Ph.D., The University of New Mexico*

This workshop will introduce participants to a model for evaluating trainee needs in learning motivational interviewing and discuss strategies for tailoring MI training to meet those needs. We will introduce participants to instruments for evaluating MI competence and discuss new research pertaining to active ingredients of this clinical method.

## **CALL FOR PAPERS**

Proposals are invited for contributed presentations at ICTAB-12. Submitted papers should be based on original research relevant to the nature, prevention, and treatment of addictive behaviors. Papers describing outcome and process research with treatment and prevention programs are particularly encouraged.

Abstracts may not exceed 500 words and should reflect the basic methodology and findings of the work to be presented. Research in progress may be submitted if informative new results will clearly be available by the time of the conference.

Most submitted papers will be scheduled for *poster sessions* rather than oral presentations. This permits simultaneous presentation of multiple papers through visual displays and enables presenters to converse with interested participants. Symposia, workshops, or roundtable discussions may also be proposed, and will be accepted on a more limited basis.

***Abstracts must be received no later than November 13, 2009.*** Abstracts will be reviewed, and notification of acceptance or non-acceptance will be sent via e-mail by ***November 30.*** All presenters must register for the conference. No fee waiver is provided for presenters of contributed presentations. Submit abstracts via email to Delilah Yao: [dyao@unm.edu](mailto:dyao@unm.edu). **ICTAB New Investigator Award.** A panel appointed from among the invited speakers will select the winner of the ***ICTAB New Investigator Award*** for outstanding research on the treatment of addictive behaviors. Eligible for consideration are empirical studies pertaining to the treatment (including primary or secondary prevention) of addictive behaviors, submitted by individuals with not more than 5 years of post-degree experience at the time of submission. Current students are also eligible. *To be considered, a full research report (not an abstract) must be submitted via email by December 1, 2009, to Delilah Yao: [dyao@unm.edu](mailto:dyao@unm.edu).* Please reference **“New Investigator Award”** on the email subject line. A written letter must also be sent clearly describing the applicant's role in the submitted research. The winner will be announced at the ***Conference Banquet*** on Tuesday evening, and will receive a US \$2000 award.
